What to Expect in a Digital Scholarship Appointment

A librarian from the Digital Scholarship & Scholarly Communication Services Team will work with you one-on-one or in a small group to:

- find copyright-free images, videos, and multimedia content for your project, paper, presentation, capstone, or dissertation
- understand your copyrights as an author, teacher, learner, and researcher
- learn how to create an online exhibit to showcase your work
- brainstorm how to promote and maintain your work through your own public website or blog
- identify publications or conference venues to share your work
- learn tips and best practices for organizing your files and research data
- learn about the peer review publishing and editorial process
- be connected to other campus resources such as visualization and data analysis services

Who Could Benefit from a Digital Scholarship Appointment?

Digital Scholarship appointments may be helpful for students who are interested in developing a multimedia project or exhibit, learning about how to develop a digital presence and share their work publicly, or are working on a research, capstone, dissertation, or course project that requires data and file management.
