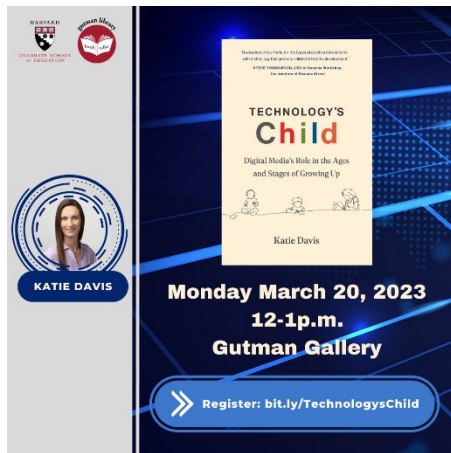
Announcing the 2023 Student Research Symposium

What happens to the little ones, the tweens, and the teenagers, when technology becomes a critical part of their lives?

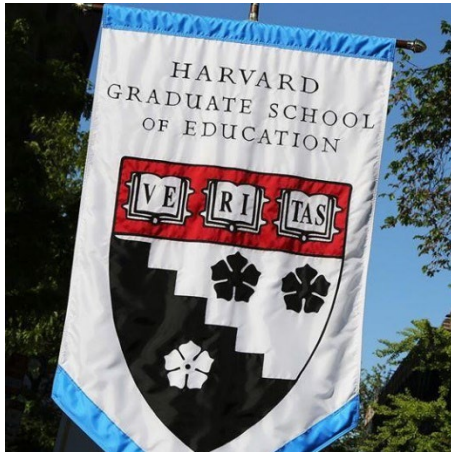

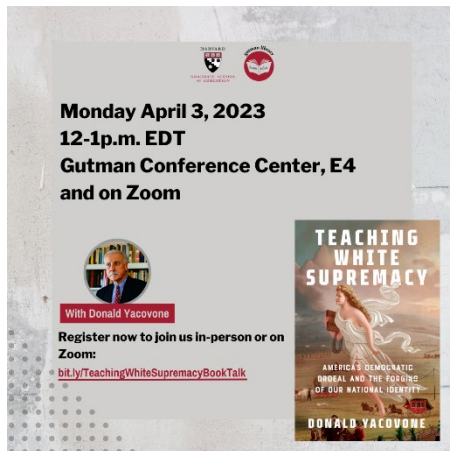


Education Entrepreneurship Summer Fellowship

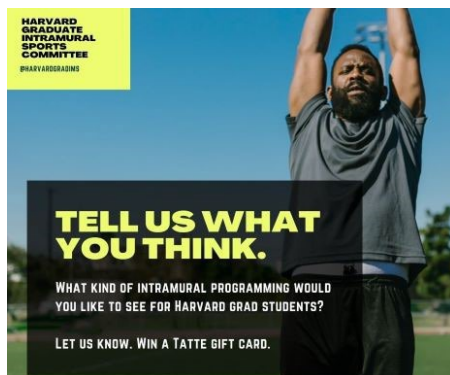
Gutman Library Hybrid Book Talk - Teaching White Supremacy: America's Democratic Ordeal and the Forging of Our National Identity

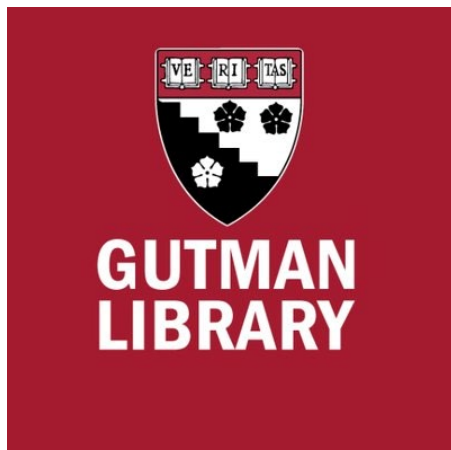

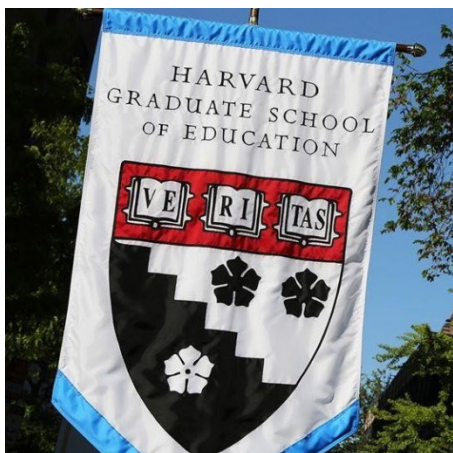
