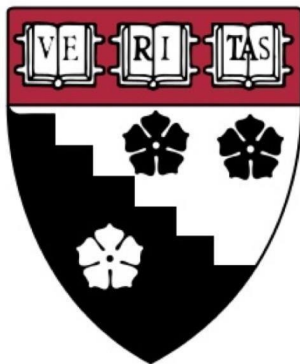

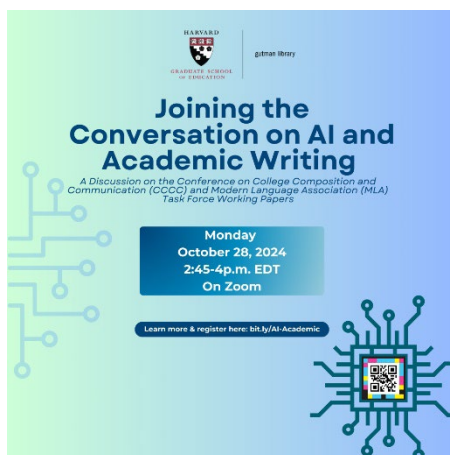

Understanding U.S. Elections: A Primer

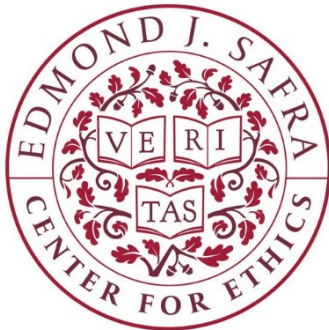

this year's WAGs.

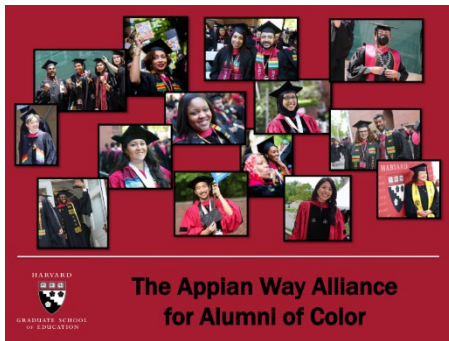
