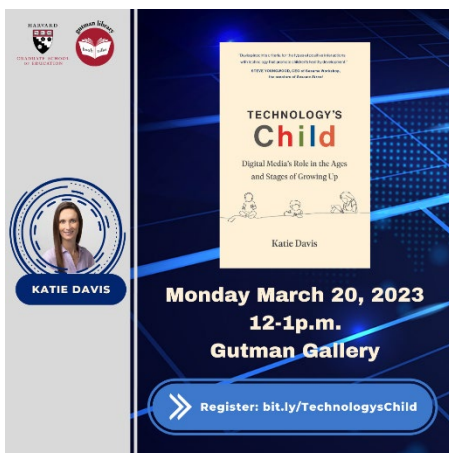

What happens to the little ones, the tweens, and the teenagers, when technology becomes a critical part of their lives?

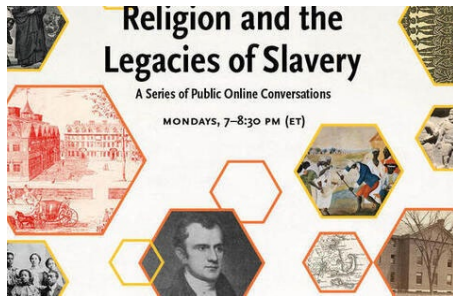

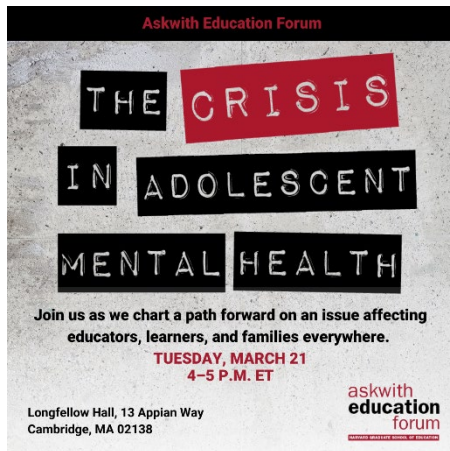

This exhibition, curated by students in the Arts and Learning concentration, explores the following questions: What does it mean to feel centered amongst chaos?

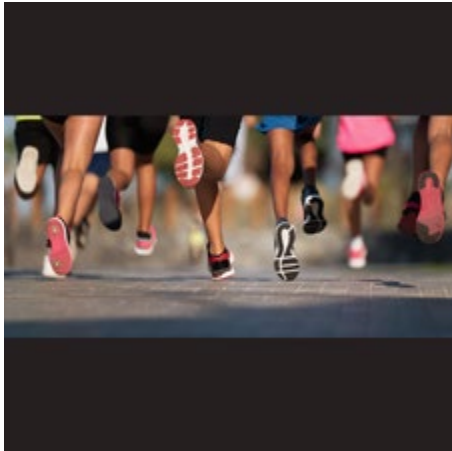

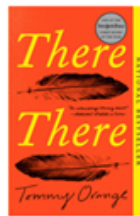

Tressie McMillan Cottom is a sociologist, public thinker, and writer. Her collection of essays, *Thick* (The New Press, 2020), investigated how Black women's lives are shaped by structural racism and femininity. Her first book, *Lower Ed* (The New Press, 2017), examined and critiqued the role of for-profit colleges in the American economic landscape and their contributions to inequality in this country. Cottom's ongoing New York Times opinion columns offer perspectives on culture, politics, and the economics of our everyday lives, while her podcast with Rouven Casp, "Hear to Stay," offers a Black feminist perspective on life, money, love, and culture.

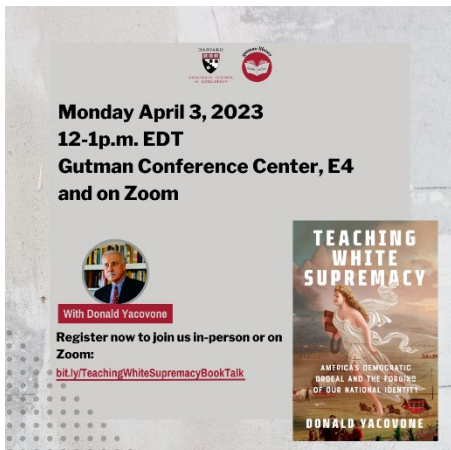

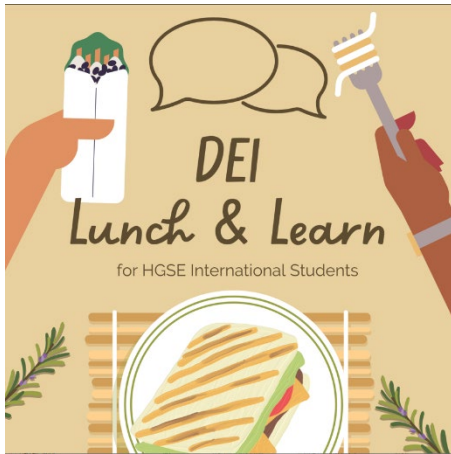

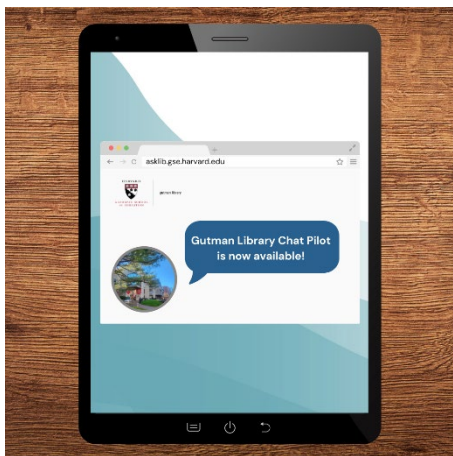
This workshop introduces the latest cross-media methods for deepening student learning and engagement that adapt to multiple disciplines and grade levels.

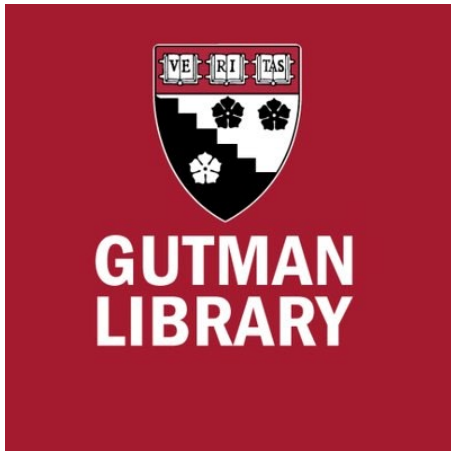
