## **Looking to Launch a Student Organization at HGSE?**


The HGSE <u>Student Organization Recognition</u> <u>Request Form</u> and Online Training are now live!

- submit a Recognition Request
- and complete the Online Training (~1 hour).

A student organization is defined as a group of HGSE students who unite to promote or celebrate a common interest. The content of any student organized event should address an academic, cultural, or social need at HGSE.
